The ACGME endorsed [general competencies for residents](#) to the level expected of a new practitioner. **Note how the medical home concept fits into these outcome competencies in pediatric residency training.**

- **Patient Care - Accessible, Family Centered, Compassionate, Comprehensive, Continuous, & Coordinated Care**
Residents must be able to provide patient care that is compassionate, appropriate, and effective for the treatment of health problems and the promotion of health.
- **Medical Knowledge - Comprehensive Care**
Residents must demonstrate knowledge about established and evolving biomedical, clinical, and cognate (e.g. epidemiological and social-behavioral) sciences and the application of this knowledge to patient care.
- **Practice-based learning and improvement - Comprehensive, Coordinated Care**
Residents must be able to investigate and evaluate their patient care practices, appraise and assimilate scientific evidence, and improve their patient care practices.
- **Interpersonal & communication skills - Family-Centered & Coordinated Care**
Residents must be able to demonstrate interpersonal and communication skills that result in effective information exchange and teaming with patients, their patients families, and professional associates.
- **Professionalism - Culturally Effective Care**
Residents must demonstrate a commitment to carrying out professional responsibilities, adherence to ethical principles, and sensitivity to a diverse patient population.
- **Systems-based practice - Accessible & Coordinated Care**
Residents must demonstrate an awareness of and responsiveness to the larger context and system of health care and the ability to effectively call on system resources to provide care that is of optimal value.
